### After Hours

If you call the clinic after hours you will be transferred to HealthLink or you can call HealthLink directly at 966-7890. HealthLink has nurses to provide phone assistance. The UNC Department of Medicine provides medical supervision with attending physicians on-call at all times.

### Emergency Care CALL 911

For a life-threatening injury or illness, go directly to the nearest Emergency Department or call 911. UNC Hospitals Emergency Department is located in the Neuroscience Hospital on Manning Drive.

### Blood/Body Fluid Exposure

Keep source patient on-site and call the clinic **immediately** at 966-9119 (if it is after-hours you will be transferred to HealthLink). The clinic will provide management via established post-exposure protocols. Risk assessment will be initiated, blood work on the source will be obtained, and the exposed employee will be instructed where to report for further care.

## University Employee Occupational Health Clinic

UEOHC provides comprehensive occupational health services to employees. The UNC Department of Medicine operates the Clinic through an agreement with the UNC Department of Environment, Health and Safety (EHS). The goals of the Clinic are to maintain and improve the occupational health of employees.

### Services Provided

#### Medical Treatment

Treatment of all non-life-threatening work-related injuries and illnesses, including communicable disease exposures. Treatment of work-related injuries does not require an appointment. The affected employee's supervisor should call the clinic to advise that an injured employee is en route and to provide a brief description of the nature of the injury. Employees with life-threatening illnesses or very serious injuries should go directly to the nearest Emergency Department or call 911.

#### Workers' Compensation Treatment and Case Management

The clinic's Physician Assistant will provide initial/on-going care and arrange for any necessary services including referrals to specialists and rehabilitation services. Lost work-time or work restrictions will be coordinated by the clinic. The Physician Assistant will provide case management services until the employee has returned to their previous level of functioning.

#### Blood/Body Fluid Exposure Care

Following established protocols, the clinic staff provides immediate management for employees who have experienced blood/body fluid exposure. It is the responsibility of the exposed employee and/or his/her supervisor to contact the clinic **immediately** in the event of an exposure.

#### Other Communicable Disease Exposure Care

Management of employees with work-related exposure to tuberculosis or other communicable diseases.

#### Medical Surveillance of Employees Working With Biohazardous Agents, Animals, and/or Chemical Carcinogens

Maintain appropriate medical monitoring of employees with potential exposure to hazardous agents in coordination with EHS.

#### Appropriate Immunization Screening and Medical Surveillance for Employees Working in Healthcare Environments

Services include health history, latex allergy screening, immunization review, annual tuberculosis skin testing, annual respirator surveillance testing, and immunizations such as Hepatitis B, Mumps, Measles, Tdap, or Rubella vaccine as indicated.

#### Screening and Medical Surveillance for Non-Healthcare Employees as Required by Regulatory or Accrediting Bodies

Services are dependent upon the occupation of the employee and may include physical examinations, pulmonary function tests, tuberculosis skin tests, or baseline serum samples.

#### Travel Immunization Clinic

Travel Immunization review and appropriate protective immunizations provided for employees planning work-related foreign travel.

#### Coordination With HealthLink for After-Hours Injuries/Illnesses

HealthLink provides after-hours access to nurse triage and physician services.
