Fueling Process	Remove the pump nozzle and insert it into the vehicle tank. Be sure to insert nozzle tip completely to avoid spills and to engage automatic shutoff system.	Fall Hazards Spills Explosive Hazards		Place fuel cap in provided section on fuel door or in a location where it will not roll away. Never leave car unattended while gas is pumping. Don't over fill car, car is usually full when automatic shut off works. Do not put water on gas spill. Use the spill kit located near the pump or contact service station attendants if any spills or overflows occur.				
Fueling Completion	Turn off fuel dispenser. Replace fuel nozzle. Replace vehicle fuel cap. Tighten until you hear a click.	Spills Fall and Trip Hazard		Make sure fuel cap and vent are locked. Be sure not to trip over nozzle hose while fueling vehicle.
